Boise State University will accept mailed and faxed transcripts as official provided they meet these guidelines:

Mailed Transcript: Received in sealed envelope. Sent directly from your school.

Faxed Transcript:

- Sent directly to the Admissions Office from your school.
- Transcript must be considered official by your office.
- Has a fax header line showing the school and office name, fax number, date and time of the transmission, and the number of pages.
- Must be accompanied by a cover sheet that shows:
